

CRUISE NIGHTS 2018 RECAP

The last Cruise Night of the season was a blockbuster for the LCPAAA. Not only was it our best night of the season, we surpassed all expectations. The evening's total sales for popcorn and beverages came to \$1101.00, the tip jar added \$81, and raffle sales totaled \$147 for the season. The 2018 season total came to \$4,796 which averaged out to \$480 per night. Compare that to the 2017 total sales of \$3,425 which averaged out to \$343 per night.

Of course none of this would be possible without the efforts of our tireless volunteers. A great big thank you to Trish Meyer, Scott Minor, and Dan Brink for making sure the equipment, coolers, beverages and popcorn machine got set up every week. It goes without saying that our volunteer workers each week were awesome. We had a great turnout of volunteers who worked tirelessly to help make the Cruise Night season a huge success.


Roadside Safety Check
